Summary. This research school devotes attention to historical problems in Ukraine in the 20th and the early 21st centuries. We deal with such issues as a) the sociopolitical, socio-economic, national, cultural and religious life in Ukraine in the second half of the 20th century; b) the current political, economic and spiritual life in the Volyn region and in Western Polissya; c) the strengthening of the independent Ukrainian state and social transformations at the end of the 20th and the beginning of the 21th centuries.

Results of scientific school. A number of academic works dedicated to the modern history of

Ukraine have been published; the supervisor of our school has published five individual monographs; several chapters in collective monographs; a number of collections of documents and materials; and a series of research articles. Member of the school have published four individual monographs, and almost 40 research articles; five issues of *The Collections of the Scientific and Systematic Materials and the Research Articles of the History Department* (issues 7–11, 2002–2006) have been published; textual and illustrative material from the collective work *Western Polissya: History and Culture* has been prepared.
