*Areas of scientific research.* Based on the author's conception of modernism (psychoanalytical and structuralistic), works of Ukrainian and foreign twentieth-century writers are investigated in terms of their association with one modernistic style or another. The typological phenomenon of modernism is analysed, in connection with which Ukrainian modernism fits into the European and global literary context.
