1. Abstracts should not exceed 5 pages of printed text on A4 sheets typed in MS Word.

2. Margins: top, bottom, left, right – 20 mm.

3. Headset: Verdana 14 pt., Line spacing – 1.15; style – Normal.

4. In the upper right corner of the letter indicate the name and surname of the author, the name of the organization, and the country where the author works (font Verdana 14 pt).

5. The next line indicates the name of the thesis - capital letters, cantered (font Verdana 14 pt, bold).

6. For the names of tables and figures, use the font 14 pt, bold. The text in the tables – font 12 pt, bold. Formulas are placed in the centre, and the numbering of formulas is carried out on the right edge. Formulas must be typed in Microsoft Equation 3.0.

7. Literary sources (font 12 pt), cited should be numbered in accordance with the order of reference to them in the text. Links to the source and the pages in it are given in square brackets. The list of references is given at the end of the abstracts by the bibliographic list of sources in the original language. Design of bibliographic sources in accordance with the APA6.
